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
Welcome to Mihara



Mihara Museum of History and Folklore



1 Takinomiya Shrine

Takinomiya Shrine, which enshrines the god Susanoo-no-Mikoto, is a famous shrine for warding off evil. The Spring Festival, held on Showa Day in April, is a grand event with portable shrines, demonstrations of kendo and karate, and karaoke. Takinomiya Shrine puts great effort in its collectible red stamp collection, with a new design every month.



Red Stamp Book

Many temples and shrines that are remnants of the castle town can still be seen around Mihara Station. Be sure to take a "Mihara Red Stamp Book" along as you stroll around this area. You can purchase a stamp book at Takinomiya Shrine, the Mihara Shinmei no Sato roadside station, and Ukishiro Lobby.

2 Gokurakuji Temple

Don't miss the Main Hall of Gokurakuji Temple. This temple was built in the middle of the Edo period, and has been designated an Important Cultural Property of Hiroshima Prefecture. Be sure to also visit Daruma Memorial Hall (reservations required), which features displays of 7,000

daruma dolls from all over Japan. You can see a mountain of daruma dolls, of all sizes!





Oshima Shrine

Oshima Shrine predates the construction of Mihara Castle. It was built at the same time as the Oshima Inari Shrine in Oshima, and Itsukushima Shrine, which was a dream of Kobayakawa Takakage. The approach to the shrine, with gentle stone steps and three torii gates, is a popular place for taking photos. We recommend taking a moment at the top of the stone steps to enjoy the view overlooking Mihara.





SUISHIN YAMANE HONTEN is a sake brewery that was founded in 1860. Yokoyama Taikan, a major figure in Japanese painting, said that "Suishin's sake is another form of art." The ultra soft water of this region produces a rich flavor that has also earned a great reputation overseas. You can make a purchase and take a tour of the brewery(reservations required in advance).

Mihara Castle Remains



Mihara Castle was built in 1567 by reclaiming land to connect two small islands, as a base for the naval forces in the Seto Inland Sea. In 2017, it was selected for the second list of Top 100 Japanese castles. Inside JR Mihara Station, the Mihara Tourist Association has installed a red stamp location for the second list of Top 100 Japanese Castles

5 Ocha no Hiranoen

Enjoy matcha tea and purchase souvenirs at this teahouse established in 1905. The "Japanese Tea Café," opened in May 2019, is a great place to relax and enjoy sweets made with matcha and other teas. With a wide selection of tea, sweets, and sundries, this is the perfect place to shop for souvenirs.

This is the studio and gallery of Asuka Yasuda, a native of Mihara who studied pottery in the United States. You can purchase plates, vases, mugs, and teapots in unique geometrical patterns, or learn how to make pottery yourself (reservations required).

2 Sunami Beach Park

This seaside recreation area is located right next to Sunami Port. Busy with many visitors in the summer, the facilities include a beach, children's pool, and showers. Barrier-free access allows anyone to enjoy a refreshing swim in the sea, or relax in the rest area or on the open deck. Don't forget to take a photo at the "Sunami Monument" and the "Omoide Statue" in the park!

3 Sunami Inari Shrine

Just a 10-minute walk from JR Sunami Station, you can see the torii gate marking the entrance to the Inari Shrine along the side of Route 185. This shrine is said to provide blessings for giving birth to children. The torii gate (shown at low tide in this photo) seems to float on the sea at high tide, and is a popular spot for taking photos when the sea is covered with fog at sunrise.

6 Musubi Cafe & Guesthouse

This approximately 120-year-old building, which once operated as a luxurious Japanese-style inn, has been renovated. Only a short distance from the sea at Sunami, visitors can experience the charm of an old Japanese house and Japanese garden. Homemade lunches include daily specials like the "Rice Ball Set" and "Fish Set." A course meal is served for dinner. (Reservations required; limited to one group per day.) Choose from a wide variety of sweets, which go great with the coffee (an original blend).

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Island Area

Kosagi-jima Island is located so close to the port, it is as renting a bicycle to explore the island, hiking, or swimming in the sea.



1 BH2

There are several projects currently underway on Kosagi-jima Island to revitalize marginalized towns by connecting the island's environment with modern art. "BH2 (Bio-House 2)" is one such project. A vacant house on the island was rennovated and restored as a gallery and residence. It hosted an exhibition of "Tidewater" by Japanese artist Hiroshi Senju, and a curator is always on site.





2 Yado NAVEL no gakkou

This 90-year-old house on Kosagi-jima Island, where art is being used to revitalize the local area, was rennovated and reborn as a Japanese-style inn. There are four room types available: "Yuzu Room," "Sudachi Room," "Lemon Room," and "Navel Room." Additionally, there is a duplex-style room called "Hanare." An authentic Estonian sauna has also been added. $_{0.7}$ Enjoy the slow island pace while gazing out at the Seto Inland Sea before you.

Cafe CHITOKU

This café is in an old Japanese house that was rennovated by a couple who were so enamored with Sagi shima Island that they moved here from Nagoya. Menu selections are prepared with fresh vegetables grown in the garden around back, or procured locally on the island. The "Spicy Beef Tendon Curry & Island Vegetable Salad with Beverage (¥1,100)" is a popular (and spicy!) selection.

Rental Cycle




Bicycles are a convenient way to enjoy the 12-kilometer route around Sagi-shima Island. They can be rented at "Ukishiro Lobby" in Mihara Station, and taken to the island by ferry.

4 Magai Wareishi Jizo

(Saint Jizo Carved Rock Relief Image)



This Buddhist statue is carved into a huge rock (2.5 meters high by 4.9 meters wide) on the shoreline. It has a crosier in its right hand and a treasure bowl in its left. Although the entire statue is visible at low tide, the sea level nearly reaches the face at high tide.

5 Sagi-shima Island Lighthouse

In 2017, the Sagi-shima Island Lighthouse was certified as a "Lover's Lighthouse" by the Nippon Romantist Association. It is located on the north end of the island, and can be seen when approaching the island by boat.

6 To-no-Mine Senbonzakura

To-no-Mine is located on Sagishima Island, an island off the coast of Mihara. Around early April, a tunnel of cherry blossoms appears along the walking path around the circumference of this peak. The

whole area turns pink.

Hattendo Cafelie

Hattendo, famous for its cream buns, was born in Mihara. Hattendo Cafelie, located near the airport, aims to fuse a café with an atelier. It is a café, shop, factory, and hands-on workshop all in one. The "Exciting Bun-Making Experience" includes shaping and baking the dough, filling it with cream, and making your own wrapping paper—all in one compact 30-minute session. You can purchase souvenirs and enjoy sweets at the adjacent "Sora no Eki Orchard" and "Tenku Café & Factory."

2 Tenku Café & Factory

3 Sankeien Garden

This Japanese garden was built to commemorate the opening of Hiroshima Airport. Its name comes from the three landscapes of Hiroshima: mountains, country villages, and the sea. There is a café where you can relax with a cup of matcha tea or other refreshments. The garden is only a 5-minute walk from Hiroshima Airport. It is a great way to enjoy the landscapes of Hiroshima in a compact area.

Mihara Shinmei Ichi (Market)





This festival welcomes spring to Mihara. It is affectionately referred to as "Shinmei-san" by the local residents.The highlight and symbol of the festival is "Japan's

largest daruma doll, " which stands 3.9 meters in height and weighs 500 kg. Stalls line the streets, where many people enjoy shopping every year.

Kui-Inari Shrine Ofuku-birakisai (Naked Festival)



Hundreds of men cleanse their bodies in the Mitsugigawa River, and then climb to the shrine to compete for red and white flags that

represent Ofukugi (literally "the Tree of Happiness"). It is said that whoever captures the Tree of Happiness will be blessed with good luck for the rest of the year. The event always attracts many visitors.

Lake Hakuryu Fireworks in Daiwa



This fireworks festival is held every year in early April Both the fireworks and the nighttime cherry blossoms-illuminated by lanterns-create breathtaking silhouettes

on the surface of the lake. The launch site for the fireworks is nearby, and the surrounding mountains create powerful echoes, for an incredibly impressive experience.

Mihara Yassa Festival



This is a three-day summer festival in Mihara, During the first two days, many people participate in Yassa Odori dance, which is said to have

originated as a dance to celebrate the completion of Mihara Castle. A fireworks show on the third and final night brings the festival to its grand finale. Colorful fireworks light up the night sky.

Mihara Ukishiro (Floating Castle) Festival



During the Mihara Ukishiro (Floating Castle) Festival, events such as nighttime Kagura and Japanese drumming

held in the area around Mihara Castle. Don't miss the parade that features a procession of about 50 Kobayakawa samurai warriors through the castle town.
